

- Revise and refine projects to meet feasibility criteria – grant readiness!






Work Order #8 Activities

- Develop an Other Grant Sources Inventory document
 - Link SEP projects to specific leveraged funding sources
 - Secure commitments for leveraged funds
- Develop a Project Sequencing & Implementation Strategy document
 - Research and evaluate various bonding & debt reimbursement alternatives
 - Develop strategies to allow early action projects to proceed while phasing other projects over appropriate time scales

Complete Phase III by October 31, 2017




Next Steps

- Request that all 23 counties formally commit to their suite of proposed projects prior to the April 6, 2017 Gulf Consortium meeting!
- Meet with Restoration Council staff in late April 2017 to:
 - Present a detailed summary of SEP projects
 - Obtain feedback on overall consistency of the SEP suite of projects with Council goals, objectives
 - Obtain recommendations on how to ensure timely review and approval of the SEP
 - Determine recommendations on how to make SEP projects grant ready
 - Determine acceptable level of detail for defining SEP projects




Project Stage of Development

Conceptual Design Needs

- Vast majority of proposed projects need further definition and refinement
- A majority of counties have expressed a desire to conduct conceptual design work concurrent with SEP development
- Current Planning Grant includes a \$1.5 million set-aside for Conceptual Design (~30% design)
 - Restoration Council will requires a separate procurement to access and use these funds
- Procurement must be started by April to link up with SEP development schedule
